Latest Council News Meet Your New Councillors

Following the March 16 Local Government elections in Queensland, on Tuesday, April 2, the Electoral Commission of Queensland formally declared the Mount Isa results: Dan Ballard, James Coghlan, incumbent Kim Coghlan, Travis Crowther, John Doyle, and John Tully have been elected to Council. Here is some information about them:



Cr Dan Ballard

A champion country jockey, Cr Ballard was born and raised in Mount Isa. He started a jockey apprenticeship in Grade 11 and lived on the Gold Coast for three-and-a-half years to complete his training.

He moved back to Mount Isa in 2006 and undertook an apprenticeship as an auto electrician. He then worked in the mining industry and has held a range of jobs in the resources sector since.

Today, he is the manager of the Mount Isa branch of mining technology business RCT, and has been married to Lacey for 11 years.



Cr James CoghlanCr Coghlan was born and raised

in Mount Isa before leaving in his late 20s to live in Brisbane to increase his opportunities in sport.

He and his wife returned 20 years ago and have lived here ever since.

"We need to encourage people to come and stay in Mount Isa. I believe that requires anybody here having the same opportunities as those on the coast," Cr Coghlan said.



Cr Kim Coghlan

Born and raised in Mount Isa, Cr Coghlan is proud to call Mount Isa her home. Her priorities for the next four years include:

- Telstra Hill Upgraded to a safe standard then secure funding to revitalise the entire area;
- A business case to develop the Multisport Centre into a larger centre with five inside courts, a climbing wall, and a safer parking area;
- North West School Sports
- Continue to work with the State to improve the opportunities for local children to represent in all sports at a state level, and for a North West Sport officer to be based in Mount Isa;
- Clear out the Leichhardt River of debris and foliage to allow water to flow more freely into Lake Moondarra; and
- Finalise the North West Water business case, to ensure any savings that are highlighted can be passed on to the community.



Cr Travis Crowther

Cr Crowther is a local business owner, father, and an active member of Commerce North West and a range of sporting

His priorities are growing the local economy by implementing sustainable development projects and promoting job creation; enhancing liveability by delivering local infrastructure for the benefit of all residents; bringing transparency and accountability to local governance; and strengthening community engagement and involvement.

After completing an electrical apprenticeship, he worked in the mines for several years, later working at Malouf Autos.

Today he is the owner of The Boss Shop Mount Isa. He is married to Megan and they have three sons.

His community involvement includes being the president of Mount Isa Netball, Warrigals Rugby Union Club, and Commerce North West.

works alongside young people in the community every day.


He is a family man and is passionate about sport and the opportunities it can bring for communities, especially for youth.
