Council has begun implementing its Transitioning Mount Isa's Economy strategy, with two stakeholder engagement sessions held in March.

.

One workshop was for representatives of local small- to medium-sized businesses, and was run in conjunction with consultants Urban Economics.

It was held on March 4 at the Redearth Hotel boardroom.

The second workshop will be held on Monday, March 19, from 10am to 2pm at the Civic Centre, and is for the region's agricultural landholders and graziers. Attendees were encouraged to share



their business perceptions, expectations, opportunities, and needs in this time of transition.

They also got a chance to hear more about the ongoing work towards transitioning Mount Isa's economy.

These workshops were held following Glencore's announcement in October last year that it will be closing its Mount Isa copper-mining and copper-processing operations by 2025.

At its December 2023 Ordinary Meeting, Council accepted the feasibility study for the development of a motorsports complex on the R48 Reserve, off Moondarra Drive, about 500m from the Ryan Road turnoff.

Council will complete further regulatory requirements – such as a flora and fauna survey of the area, an environmental impact assessment, core infrastructure report, and cultural heritage assessment – as well as look for external funding for further development



opportunities. The next steps for the committee are to explore – with input from stakeholders – the feasibility of holding a series of motoring events, including a Go to Whoa competition, burnout competition, and streetcar drag racing, as well as expanding the existing annual Show and Shine event. Once the above are completed, a further business case can be developed in support of any further funding submissions.

A reminder that Local Government elections in Queensland will be held on Saturday, March 16. Pre-poll voting is available at the Civic Centre until Friday, March 15.

Boil-Water Notice

Council conducts regular monitoring for E. coli bacteria in the water supply system. Recent water monitoring has shown E. coli to be present in the water supply system in Camooweal.

The presence of these bacteria indicates that the water may be contaminated with organisms that may cause disease.

As a precaution, Camooweal residents are advised that water for consumption should be brought to a rolling boil. Water should then be allowed to cool and stored in a clean container with a lid and refrigerated.

Cooled boiled or bottled water should be used for: drinking; cooking; washing raw foods (such as salads); making ice; cleaning teeth; and pets' drinking water.

Dishes should be washed in hot soapy water or in a dishwasher.

Children should take bottled or cooled boiled water to school.

E. coli itself is generally not harmful, but its presence in drinking water is often associated with faecal contamination.

Council is working to alleviate the problem. Precautions should be taken until further notice.

Council advises that rates notices for residential and non-residential properties for the period ending 30 June 2024 were issued on Monday 12 February, and are due for payment in full by 4.30pm on Wednesday 13 March 2024.

Rates notices have been posted to the last known postal address registered with Council.

It is the owner's responsibility to notify Council in writing of any change of address.

If you have not received your rates notice, please contact Council to obtain a copy. Due to a change in Council's finance systems, rates and water notices will now be issued on separate accounts.

This means that your rates and water notices will have different account and payment reference details.

When paying your rates or water notice, please check your payment details to ensure you are making the payment to the correct account.

For ratepayers that receive notices electronically, and with the change in systems, you may be required to re-register to eNotices to receive your notices.

UPCOMING SHOW: Opera

Queensland's latest production – "Do We Need Another Hero?" – is coming to Mount Isa, thanks to Council funding.


At its February 28 Ordinary Meeting, Council agreed to support Opera Queensland's 2024 Regional Tour performance by providing \$8800, which will cover the show's presenters fee.

A live musical tribute, "Do We Need Another Hero?" is set to be performed at the Mount Isa Civic Centre in May.

It is from the creative team behind "Are You Lonesome Tonight" and "Lady Sings the Maroons".

The show is described as a fusion of the classical and the contemporary, blending the grandeur of opera with chart-topping anthems that pay homage to heroes from every corner of the world, from artists including the Beatles, David Bowie, and John Farnham.

Council has previously financially supported the Opera Queensland performances "Are You Lonesome Tonight" in 2021, "Composed in Queensland" in 2022, and "Lady Sings the Maroons" in 2023.



Opera Queensland conducts regional tours each year, delivering opera-based performances to cities and towns throughout regional Oueensland.

EVENT SPONSORSHIP: Council will be a Diamond sponsor of this year's Zonta Club of Mount Isa's International Women's Day Celebrations, to be held on April 20 at the Mount Isa Civic Centre.

At its February 28 Ordinary Meeting, Council approved a \$5000 sponsorship of the event. The Zonta Club of Mount Isa has redesigned its International Women's Day event, giving it a fresh new approach.

The changes include a new separate International Women's Day Dinner, created to recognise Young Women of Achievement in the community, with new criteria and a different way of recognising nominees.

The Young Women of Achievement Dinner will be held at the Redearth Boutique Hotel on Friday, March 8. The Celebrating Women event will be held at the Civic Centre on Saturday, April 20. Council is a regular sponsor of the Zonta Club of Mount Isa's International Women's Day events. **SPLASH OF COLOUR:** A mural will soon be installed on the western-facing wall of Splashez Aquatic Centre, after Council endorsed a recommendation from its Regional Arts Development Fund (RADF) Committee to go ahead with the project.

The endorsement was given during Council's February 28 Ordinary Meeting.

Council will now move ahead with a procurement process, to seek quotations and a design for the mural.

It's envisaged the mural will create a welcoming environment at the Splashez entry and have an aquatic theme.

The project's estimated cost is between \$20,000 and \$30,000 (depending on the artist, design, and preparation requirements) and will be covered by the RADF budget for Council-initiated projects.

Council will undertake community and Council consultation prior to the design being finalised.

RADF is a partnership with the Queensland Government to deliver both a community grants program, as well as Council-initiated projects.

The program's objectives are to support arts and cultural activities that provide public value for Queensland communities; build local cultural capacity, cultural innovation, and community pride; and deliver the Queensland Government's objectives for the community.

The Mount Isa Regional Arts Development Fund committee is made up of local volunteers and represents a cross-section of the local community arts sector.
