Latest Council News Telstra Hill Works to Begin

Council has agreed to award the contract for Stage 1 of the Telstra Hill Upgrade Project.

Stage 1 will involve upgrading a section of road from the Telstra Hill entrance, and the construction of a new carpark (about 2000 sqm size) near the base of the hill.

The contract, worth \$362,328 (excluding GST), has been awarded to Oaka Constructions Pty Ltd.

Stage 1 works will cost \$476,484 in total.

The decision to award the contract was made at Council's April Ordinary Meeting on Wednesday, April 24.

The Telstra Hill Upgrade Project will be completed in three stages.

Stage 2 will involve carrying out drainage and civil works for the road formation; the construction of a new 1.5km access road from the proposed car park, to enable safe pedestrian access from the bottom to the top of Telstra Hill; and the installation of road signage, speed bumps, line marking, and bollards.

Stage 3 proposes to construct a pedestrian path along the northern verge of the Barkly Highway, to allow safe pedestrian travel from the city to Telstra Hill.

Stage 1 is expected to begin later this month and be completed in the second half of this year.
